#### **Voice**

- Active Voice
- Passive Voice

In active voice the subject of the verb does something.

Ex: Rakesh kicked the ball.

In passive voice something is done to the subject.

Ex: The ball was kicked by Rakesh.

# To Change An Active Verb To A Passive Verb

- Use to be form with the past participle
   (ex: was is a form of to be and kicked is past participles).
- 2. Shift the subject to the place of the object, and the object to the place of the subject.
- Add the preposition by before the agent.(The ball was kicked by Rakesh).

## Some other kinds of Passive Sentences

#### 1) When there is a Modal Verb

modal verb + be + past participle

Or

modal verb + have + been + past participle passive forms.

Ex: I can win this match.

This match can be won by me.

He may have finished lunch.

Lunch may have been finished by him

#### 2) When there is a command

In this case the form of verb is let + be + past participle.

Ex: open the door.

let the door be opened.

Bring a glass of water.

let a glass of water be brought.

Or

you are ordered/asked to open the door/t bring a glass of water.

## 3) When there are two objects

Passive form ca be made by making either the direct or the indirect object the subject and retaining the other object.

Ex: He gave her a bouquet. she was given a bouquet by him.

Or A bouquet was given to her by him.

# 4) When verb is followed by object+infinitive

Ex: a)He asked me *to send* a application form.

I was asked to send an application form (by him)

b) They believe him to be dangerous. He is believed to be dangerous (by them).

# 5) When there is an object compliment

After some verbs the direct object can be followed by an object compliment which is a noun or an adjective that describes or classifies the object.

Ex: a) The teacher considered him a <u>dullard</u>.He was considered a <u>dullard</u> by the teacher.b) They elected Mr. Rao president.

Mr. Rao was elected president.

## 6) When there is a request

Requests can be converted into passive form in more than one ways. When the verb has two subjects either can be made the subject in the passive. Please/kindly is placed between may and be.

Ex: a) Please give me some more time.

Some more time may please be given to me.

b)Kindly grant me a week's leave.

A week's leave may kindly be granted to me.

# 7) Passive form for try/refuse to+bare infinitive would be tried/refused +to +be + past participle

Ex: a) He **tried to** secure good marks.

Good marks were tried to be secured by him.

b) The teacher <u>tried to</u> improve the students' performance.

Students' performance was **tried to be improved** by the teacher.

c) He refused to pay the fine.

The fine was **refused to be paid** by him.
